Lollipop Person

As you all know, we are still without a crossing patrol in Wheelbarrow Castle. The council are still keen to employ somebody but, as yet, nobody has applied to the advertisements. In case anybody can think of somebody who might be interested, below is a little detail about the role, taken from the council website.

Becoming a lollipop man or lollipop lady

School crossing patrols play an important part in the life of the community. At 125 sites in West Sussex, school crossing patrols are employed at the start and finish of each school day. Although exact times vary from site to site, the commitment is usually 30-40 minutes each morning and again in the afternoon when children are walking to and from school.

The rate of pay is £7.19 per hour and, of course, you only work in term time. Salary is spread equally over 12 months, so pay is the same each month, even over the summer holiday and half terms. You also get paid for public holidays. There is no upper age limit and we have several patrol people in their seventies. Uniform and training are provided.


From April to August we also run hourly training sessions on the Rotherfield Sports Ground in Dodsley Lane from 5pm to 8pm.
