# A Word from the Head

At this week's 'Tea with Mr C', I was joined by several parents – a marked improvement on last term when I had tea on my own! Amongst other things, we discussed the nature of a Church of England maintained school and the new project initiative, looking at the A2 frames in house colours on the walls.

As mentioned in earlier newsletters, some of these frames contain examples of projects produced by members of staff to give children ideas about what a project could look like and how they might do better! It was suggested that the guidelines displayed in two of the frames for the children to study might be made available to parents on the Moodle and they have now been uploaded onto the Parents' section, so do please have a look.

When I discussed the project initiative with staff, my original idea was that it would be aimed at KS2 (Y3-6). Staff felt that KS1 (Y1-2) should also be included and, as it turns out, the very first pupil project went up this week and it was produced by Emilia in Hedgehogs and it was on tunnels! Well done, Emilia!

We marked Safer Internet Day this week with a couple of assemblies and Liz Evans, our Computing Lead, has started working with a recently recruited group of pupils, the E-safety Crew, to produce a children's guidance on responsible online safety. We have recently become aware of incidents, outside of school, where unpleasant comments have been made towards others on gaming messaging systems and we hope that the work of this new group of children will help to combat this.



Following this term's spelling bee, many children have asked when the next one will be. As some of these pupils were Year 6 pupils who will leave at the end of next term, we have decided to hold the next spelling bee at the start of next term, releasing the words for the first round at the end of this term so that children can learn them over the holiday. Having talked


with staff, I suspect the format will remain roughly the same but any tweaks will be highlighted.

# Five Ways to WellBeing Workshop



On Friday 27<sup>th</sup> January, Foxes class took part in a 'Five Ways to Wellbeing Workshop'. Five Ways is an organisation that goes into schools to help teach children how to look after themselves and how to get along with each other in a fun and calm way. We had five workshops during the day, called: Give, Take Notice, Be Active, Connect and Keep Learning.

In 'Connect' we learned about the importance of internet safety. We learnt about the importance of internet safety. We learnt how to be 'SMART' This stands for Safety, Meeting, Accepting, Reliable and Tell. In the 'Take Notice' workshop the staff taught us about relexology and gave us hand cream.
