A Word from the Head

Dear Parents,

The term is in full swing and the summer holidays seem a distant memory. Teachers have held their 'Meet the Teacher' meetings and parents, hopefully, have a sense of the events and priorities of the term ahead. If you weren't able to attend your child's 'Meet the Teacher', don't despair as the PowerPoint presentations that accompanied them are available. Let the office know if you haven't received a copy and tell them whether you would prefer a physical or electronic format. Equally, if you still have questions about other aspects of the term, do let us know and we will do our best to answer them!

Car Park and Drop-Off Zone

A number of parents have expressed concerns about the car park this term and I would like to appeal for parental support on this issue.



This zone is for the sole purpose of dropping off your child. It is not there for parking, so vehicles should never be without a driver. Once a child has been dropped, cars should move off. If cars are unable to flow through this area, the traffic backs up and often results in the pedestrian crossing being obscured. This puts our children at risk. Understandably, parents of young children may not want to use the drop-off zone, so please park in the car park and walk your child into school. Please use the drop-off zone appropriately.

Although we are lucky enough to have the largest car park for a primary school in our area, I know it can be become rather congested and there are times when parents will have to be patient and wait for spaces to become free. There was an incident earlier in the week when a parent blocked in another car and did not return to move it for over half an hour. Please be considerate when parking.

Parent Governor Elections

As Jo Asman's term as Parent Governor comes to an end, we thank her for all her hard work and dedication to the school during her term as governor. This means we have a Parent Governor vacancy to fill. The governing body is a dedicated and friendly group representing a wide cross section of our local community. The governor's role is interesting and rewarding and crucial to the continued growth of Easebourne.

If you are interested in standing there will be a letter sent home on Monday with further details. You will need to complete the attached nomination form, obtaining the signatures of two parents who support your nomination, and return it to the school office by 3.30pm on Friday 29th September.

Poetry Week

I met with the judges for our poetry recitation competition earlier this week to look ahead to this term's event. We sat and discussed the poems the children could choose from and the list will be released to them at the start of Poetry Week, on Monday, 9th October. We are very excited about the range this year and hope there will be something for everyone. We have tried to include some classics along with poems that have a humorous or emotional content. We will welcome Steve Tasane back on the Tuesday, Poetry Tuesday. Steve is a performance poet who worked with the children last year. He was very popular and we are delighted that he has agreed to spend the day with us once again. We hope that Steve's input will be boosted by a poetry squad on Poetry Tuesday. This was an experiment last year and involved members of the community who were happy to come in to share one or two of their favourite poems with the children.

Poetry Performance Day and 'Poems & Pasties'

The day of the actual competition is Friday, 3rd November. The following week, on Friday, 10th November, we plan to hold a new event, 'Poems & Pasties', after school. Winners from the competition will be invited to perform their poems again and we are currently trying to book a second performance poet for this session to enthrall us with some more high energy performance poetry. Adults coming to this session will also be invited to recite or read a poem that they would like to share. Everybody will have the opportunity to order a pasty by Monday, 6th, to eat on the night. These will be cooked locally, children's pasties will be £1.00 and adults' pasties will cost £2.50. All are welcome, so please put the date in your diary.

These forms went out earlier in the week. Please ensure they are returned next week. A form should be returned for each child, even if you are opting out there is a section on the form to accommodate this.

Starting School September 2018

If your child was born between 1st September 2013 and 31st August 2014 they can start school in September 2018. From Monday 2nd October 2017 to Monday 15th January 2018, you can apply online on the pupil Admissions Application website at www.westsussex.gov.uk. Once you have submitted your online application you will receive an automatic email acknowledgement. Free internet access to apply online is available at all West Sussex libraries and Children and Family Centres. Paper forms will only be issued to parents on request by phoning 0333 0142903 and forms need to be sent by recorded delivery. Applications made after the closing date cannot be considered until all other applications have been dealt with. Online applicants will be notified which school their child has been offered by email during the day of Monday 16th April 2018. Other applicants will be sent a letter by second class post, posted on 16th April.
