#### A Word from the Head

Dear Parents,

Welcome back to all our families. I hope you had an enjoyable summer and return to school refreshed and ready for a busy autumn term. As well as familiar faces, we welcome children to Hedgehogs, Rabbits, Badgers and all 45 of our new Reception children to Dragonflies.

Reception children will continue coming into school with staggered start times next week. From Monday, 18th September, all children will start at the same time. Doors will open from 8.40 and all children will need to arrive by 8.50, when registers will be taken. Reception children are picked up at the slightly earlier time of 3.05 from the EYFS Reception at the back of the building. Those children who are staying part-time and leaving at lunchtime will be picked up from the Main Reception.

We also welcome new staff members. Mrs Bedford has joined us as Foxes Class teacher and Mrs Clipston as Hedgehogs Class teacher. Ms. Norgrove joins us as a teaching assistant in Foxes Class and Miss Bicknell joins Badgers Class as a trainee teacher and will be with us for the academic year.

#### Open Evening for Reception Class September 2018

On Wednesday, September 20th, 6pm – 7pm, we will be holding an Open Evening for parents who have children starting Reception Class in September 2018. There will be a talk by the head and the opportunity to meet the Reception team. Year 6 guides will conduct tours of the school which will provide you with the opportunity to look round the Reception Classroom and it's recently extended outdoor area. We do hope that you will be able to attend and look forward to meeting you all.

#### **Change of Date - Parent Consultation Evening**

Please note there is a change of date for Consultation Evenings for Years 1-6. Parents' Evening will now take place on Monday, 16<sup>th</sup> October, 3.30-7.30 and Thursday, 19<sup>th</sup> October, 3.30-6.00. Parents' Evening for Reception Class will take place on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> October, 3.30-7.30pm and Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 3.30-6.00pm.

#### Contact Details, Educational Visit and Permission Forms

Parents of children in Years 1-6 will receive these forms to take home this week; please look out for a large brown envelope. It is important to update information on an annual basis in order that in an emergency our records and permissions are up to date. Please ensure you return signed paperwork next week.

Parents of children in Reception Class should have received a copy of their Data Collection Sheet. Please check all details are correct, sign and return to school.

#### Computer Access at Home

Please inform the school office if you do not have internet access at home as newsletters, diaries, clubs etc will be sent to parents by e-mail. For those parents who do not have access, a paper copy will be available to collect from the school reception.

Please also let us know if your child has either limited internet access or no access at all at home. This is important as we are promoting a wider range of online resources, e.g. Sumdog and websites for homework such as MyMaths and iHub.

For those children who find it difficult or impossible to access the internet at home, we plan to offer a weekly homework club, with internet availability, from January.

#### **Summer Reading Challenge**

If your child took part in the Library Service's Summer Reading Challenge, please do remember to send your child in with his or her certificate and medal. As before, this is our first house challenge of the year and we want to try and beat our participation total for last year. If your child hasn't quite finished, please note that the closing date for the Summer Reading Challenge is Saturday, 16<sup>th</sup> September, so there is still time to read the six books required.

#### **Summer Activity Books**

We would also like your activity books back for a display, in order to share what everybody enjoyed during their summer break. Don't forget house points are available for those children who completed the quiz. Please ensure all booklets are handed in by Friday, 15th September.

#### **Sumdog House Challenge**

The new Sumdog House Challenge for Years 1-6 starts today, Friday, 8th September and finishes on Thursday, 14th September at 8.00pm. Your child's username and password can be found in their Kit Book. The school code is easebourne-primary-school. Please note that your child's level is determined by the site, not the school. Some children may find they are asked questions that are either too easy or too hard. Please do not worry as this is how Sumdog works out the appropriate level for your child. Children answering 100 questions will earn a house point. Children answering 1,000 questions will become an Easebourne Sumdog Ninja and be invited to play for the school in future competitions. They will also receive a Ninja Agent membership card.

#### MyMaths – Years 1-6

MyMaths is an engaging online resource for use in the classroom and at home. It provides hundreds of lessons matched with online homework enhanced by vibrant games, tools and worksheets. Each lesson is linked to homework tasks so that teachers can easily assess a child's understanding inside and outside the classroom. MyMaths is designed to suit all abilities and develops fluency, reasoning and problem solving at every age. Tasks contain stretching content to challenge all children with randomised questions of a limitless potential to practise. Whole school login details were sent home before the summer holiday and your child's personal username and password can be found in their Kit Book.

#### Meet the Teacher

For Years 1-6, our Meet the Teacher sessions start next week. These give parents a chance to meet the staff who are involved in the class and learn about what is planned for the term, including ways in

which they can support their child's learning. Please try to attend your child's session. If childcare is an issue for you, please remember that class teachers make arrangements for children to be supervised by colleagues.

#### Maths Workshops for Children and Parents

Workshops for all classes will take place over the next two months and are an excellent opportunity to work alongside your child and see how they approach mathematical problems. Workshops start with an introduction by Mr Meaby, our maths co-ordinator, before you join your child's class for a working session. Please refer to the school diary for relevant dates.

#### Clubs

The club membership lists are displayed in the office window adjacent to the school's front entrance doors. Please remember to inform the office if your child is not attending a session. This is particularly important for Year 5 and 6 children who have permission to walk home.

If you have not returned your enrolment forms and subs, please ensure these are returned before the club starts.

**Science Club** – This club has proved a very popular choice and therefore has a waiting-list. Please note that, if your child continually misses sessions, their space will be offered to someone on the waiting-list.

#### **School Library**

As mentioned last term, budget cuts have forced us to take the decision to opt out of West Sussex Schools Library Service. Not subscribing to the County's library service will, inevitably, have an impact on the stock of our own library and we plan to set about gradually building up our book stock, starting with spending the commission from the sales of 'We Are Writers!' and at the recent book sale. It would also make a real difference if parents could help their children to look after our school library books and use the Junior Librarian System appropriately (scanning books out and back in).

We have lost a significant number of books from our library through non-returns and are introducing a new system to better protect the stock. We will monitor the Junior Librarian system closely and any child that has an overdue book for longer than half a term will receive a letter asking for the book to be replaced or the cost covered by their parent. We hope parents will understand the need for this tighter approach and will support us in this.

#### **Second-hand Books**

As part of the drive on boosting the library stock, we are asking parents who might be clearing out children's books that are in good condition to consider donating them to the school library. We would be very grateful for any donations.

#### **Old Shirts**

We are in need of old adult size shirts that children can use as overalls when taking part in art lessons. Please hand any suitable garments to the school office.

#### **Secondary School Transfer**

On Monday, children in Year 6 will come home with a letter for parents regarding Secondary School Transfer. All parents are encouraged to apply online at <a href="https://www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions">www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions</a>. The online system will open on Monday, 11th September at 9am and the national closing date for applications is Tuesday, 31st October. **Please note that applications made after the closing date cannot be considered until all other applications have been dealt with.** 

For parents who do not have access to the Internet at home, free access has been arranged at all West Sussex Libraries and Children and Family Centres within West Sussex or a paper copy can be issued to parents on request by calling 03330 142 903.

#### **Film Night**


