A Word from the Head

Dear Parents

The term is getting busier. Rabbits Class visited the Weald & Downland Museum and the very next day, not to be outdone, Foxes Class took it over as part of Takeover Day! My thanks to all staff involved and, of course, to the staff at the Weald & Downland where the children, by all accounts, had a great time.



Despite having a relatively large car park, there are clearly some parking issues at the moment and I have received four different concerns this week.

- 1. We have three disabled parking bays, two next to the minibuses and one at the end of the staff parking area. With the pressure on parking spaces, these are apparently being used by drivers of cars which are not displaying blue badges. This means that disabled drivers are struggling to find a parking space to enable them to pick up their children or grandchildren. **PLEASE** could drivers leave these spaces free and be mindful that not all disabilities are obvious.
- Earlier this week, it was reported to me that a driver of a car which was parked behind the drop-off zone reversed into a mother who was crossing behind her with two children. The mother pushed the children onto the pavement and, though shaken, was thankfully unhurt.
 PLEASE could drivers exercise vigilance when manoeuvring around the car park? PLEASE could pedestrians make sure they cross using the crossing.
- 3. Some parents are parking their cars outside designated spaces in the car park near the Parish Field. This is causing confusion and congestion and making manoeuvring in and out of spaces more difficult and dangerous for pedestrians using the car park. **PLEASE** use the marked spaces.
- 4. Finally, it has been reported to me that people are leaving their cars in the drop-off zone at the front of the school. This is not what it is intended for. If we can keep it free for dropping off, the traffic will flow more smoothly and cars will be able to leave the site quickly, reducing congestion. PLEASE don't park in the drop-off zone but just drop off. There should be absolutely no necessity to park in the drop-off zone at 2.30pm when the rest of the car park is empty.

The car park, though big, is under pressure at key points in the day. Car sharing, wherever possible, would reduce that pressure. Walking to school helps hugely but children need supervision crossing

Wheelbarrow Castle though the new signalised crossing will soon help with crossing the A286. Timing your arrival at the school can also help to spread the traffic load across these busy times. Finally, if there isn't a parking space when you arrive and you need one, **PLEASE** be patient and wait for one to become free.
