Due to the pressure of numbers in the area, we have been asked to take additional children into Reception from September. To manage this, Tanya Sykes will be joining Amanda Catchpole in Dragonflies Class for the next academic year and we will be recruiting a further teacher for Hedgehogs Class. When we have appointed this teacher we will try to give current Dragonflies' parents the opportunity to meet him/her in the summer term.

It's been a week of performance for Easebourne. Earlier in the week, we were treated to a wonderful production of 'What a Knight!' by Rabbits and Badgers. This Arthurian romp contained everything from spoilt princesses to evil henchmen. The comedy in the show was delivered with confidence by a cast who had clearly worked very hard and our children should be very proud of themselves. Pulling off such a successful show is no mean feat and thanks are due to Malcolm Meaby, Heidi Crew and their team.

As well as choreographing and working with the singers for the Year 3/4 production, Katie Stevens was preparing her dance group for the Rother Valley Arts Festival, held over two nights at MRC. Our dancers performed last night, fitting the Charleston to two very different pieces of music. Having rehearsed for much of the day at MRC, they danced brilliantly on the night and with obvious enjoyment. They wore exquisite costumes generously sewn for them by Katie's mother and really did the school proud. Well done!

This week, a Clevertouch screen was installed in Squirrels Class. This was made possible thanks to the fundraising of the PTFA and heralds a very exciting focus on improving the computing facilities within the school.

Tomorrow, Heidi Crew and Malcolm Meaby will be abseiling down Spinnaker Tower in Portsmouth to raise money for a second touchscreen for the school. The target set is £1,600 and the total raised, when I last checked this morning, was £762. JRSO Questionnaire

Last autumn, the County conducted a crossing patrol count at Wheelbarrow Castle and the result showed that we were a long way off the criteria to demonstrate a need for a crossing patrol. It is my belief that, with no crossing patrol for over a year, many of our parents have simply decided that walking to school is not a safe option. If this is the case, we need to put this forcefully to the County so that our situation can be reconsidered.

With this in mind, the new JRSO's have agreed to pull together a questionnaire for parents, asking them for their thoughts about the situation. I hope that they will have this ready for the end of term and that we can send it out over the holiday. Please could you take time out to fill it in and return it as our case is clearly stronger if it is patently representative of the general feelings of the parent community.

Parking

A number or parents have talked to me about their concerns about the car park this term and I would like to appeal for parental support on this issue. Whilst we are lucky to have such a number of parking spaces, I believe that the pressure is currently greater because more parents drive to school than might ordinarily do so, as we do not currently have a crossing patrol and that is something I plan to work on with the JRSO's (as mentioned previously). Parents have pointed out that the roundabout and crossing are often dangerously congested, even though there are often spaces in the far car park. At other times, when the far car park is full, it seems that the parking of cars in unmarked areas has forced children to walk round these cars and into the way of cars driving round the car park. With the safety of children in mind, therefore, could I ask parents to make sure they have checked to see whether there are spaces in the far car park before adding to the congestion around the roundabout? Could I also ask parents not to park in unmarked areas in the far car park and indeed out the front?

Concerns have also been raised about the drop-off zone. This term, I have been involved in breakfast clubs on each day at 8 o'clock and have not been out to see for myself but reports from parents confirm that there are a number of parents who still regularly leave cars in the drop-off zone. Could parents also ensure that they use the drop-off zone as just that, an area to drop off, <u>not</u> a short-term parking area? I have been told that the situation was better when JRSO's patrolled the front of the

school and I have talked with the new group and they are keen to resume this work next term, in light of parental concern.

Finally, the congestion is leading to drivers using the disabled spaces though they have no right to park in them and I have received complaints from disabled drivers that these spaces have been unavailable as a result. Please respect the fact that these are allocated for disabled use.



Projects & Photos

This week, two more A2 projects hit the walls. Freddie (Marvel) and Tilly (Ballet) both finished projects and their mentors agreed that they were ready to go up. It's great to see the children putting so much effort into these individual projects and working with staff mentors to make sure that they work to the best of their ability. The scheme is completely voluntary and there are many projects in the pipeline but, with these two this week, we already have four up to enjoy.
