Having listened to feedback about the first spelling bee, the final round was less intimidating. Children from pairs of classes competed to find stage winners so nobody had to spell words in front of the whole school.

The winner in K\$1 was Tabitha, the winner in Lower K\$2 was Izzy and the Upper K\$2 and overall winner was Phoebe. This is the second time that we have run a spelling bee this year and Phoebe has won both competitions. Out of interest, the K\$2 audience and staff threw random words at Phoebe to see how she coped. She did brilliantly, spelling correctly words like 'mnemonic', 'agoraphobia' and 'kleptomania'. In the end, she was finally tripped up by a niche word from Andy Taylor, 'quincunx'.

A quincunx is a geometric pattern consisting of five points arranged in a cross, with four of them forming a square or rectangle and a fifth at its centre.

Road Safety – could you help? (from Vikki Curwood)

The school and Easebourne Parish Council are applying to West Sussex for a traffic calming scheme on Wheelbarrow Castle near to the school entrance. This is to support all who want to cross the road, access the school and use the new play area, but specifically lone children, young families and those with limited mobility.

We need your help. Easebourne Council are setting up a mobile speed camera at specific times when there is a high level of footfall:-

- 1- 8.00-8.30am
- 2-8.30-9.00am
- 3-2.50-3.30pm
- 4- 4.00-4.30pm
- We are looking for volunteers to cover a session that they can commit to on a specific day within a 2 week period.
- A 30 minute registration and online training is compulsory in order to use the camera. We need 2 people per shift as a legal requirement.
- We advise that no children should be involved or in need of supervision during the session.

The evidence we are able to collate will support our application for a much needed traffic calming scheme that helps us all access the school and new play area safely.

The Travelling Book Fair will be in school from Wednesday 21st-Friday 23rd June. Our school earns commission on every book we sell which we will use to purchase books for our Year 6 Leavers. All books are 3 for the price of 2 so there are great bargains to be had.

Alongside this, we will be taking orders for our very own 'We are writers book'. This book is a compilation of writing from every child in the school. Each book costs £5.99 and generates 60% in terms of books for the library. The proceeds will support the restocking of non-fiction titles to support class topics studied over the year.

This has been an experiment as It is the first time we have done this at Easebourne. However, now that we know what is involved, we have decided, as a staff, to repeat the initiative, producing a second book at the end of the spring term so watch this space!

This is the first cycle of upgrading the ICT provision across the school, with the intention to install further boards in Foxes.

Summer Fair, Saturday 17th June

We are just 1 week away from our Summer Fair and things are really beginning to come together.

We are very grateful to the BBQ team, headed up by Natalie Atkins who have come up with a fantastic lunchtime menu consisting of burgers, hot dogs, veggie options, salads and fruit pots. These will all be very reasonably priced, so why not treat the family to a BBQ lunch at the fair.

The bar will be selling Pimms, beer/lager, wine and soft drinks.

This year we will have a total of FOUR inflatables for the children to enjoy. The Parish Council will have a small bouncy castle by their stall so children can enjoy a bounce whilst adults can chat to councillors.
