A Word from the Head

Staff Announcements

- Sadly, we will be losing Francesca Wade-Palmer at the end of this term, who plans to spend more time on her writing. We wish her well and thank her for her contributions to the school over the year. In particular, we thank her for all the extra time that she put in to help make the Year 5/6 play such a success.
- Our SENDCo, Emma Austin-Diment, will take on the additional role of Assistant Headteacher in September, working alongside Malcolm Meaby as Deputy Head. Emma's hours will increase from two days to two and a half days.
- Molly Stringer will become the admin assistant to the office staff in September.
- Anne Nixon will work with Badgers on Thursdays, covering Malcolm Meaby's leadership time.
- Finally, we will welcome four teaching assistants, Carol Ann Smithers, Aliska Elliott, Stephanie Abbott and Nichaela Boxall, onto the staff to support children with specific needs.

Drop-off Arrangements

As parents will know, improving the school's security and the children's safety has been a key issue this year and a subject of much discussion with governors and parents. From September, the front doors will have an entry phone arrangement, as is the case with most schools. This will ensure that nobody can access the school building on the occasions when the front desk is unmanned.

With the buzzer system installed, it will now be possible to improve the drop-off procedure further. Parents and children will wait outside the main front entrance until **08:40** when the outer and inner front doors will be opened. Children (Y1-Y6) will then enter through the front of the school. Parents will be able to talk with the office staff at this point but will not be admitted into the school unless they have made an appointment or are volunteering and have collected a lanyard. Please note that children who attend a breakfast club will continue to be admitted earlier but will need to be buzzed in. On those days when it is raining and parents have arrived early with children, they may still go round the building and shelter under the canopy to be let in at the back of the library. Please note children are not the responsibility of the school until 08.40.

Change of Drop-off Time for Dragonflies

After much consultation with parents, we are changing the drop-off time for Dragonflies Class to come in line with the rest of the school, i.e. 08:40-08:50. Children will continue to use the same route to the back of the school but will now enter through the back of the classroom via the little side gate into their outside area.

Changes to Before-School Provision

Early Days have agreed to trial a new before-school provision which will hopefully be more flexible and convenient for parents.

The proposals are as follows:

- Before-school Club (nursery children) 08:00-09:00 £5.00 (incl. breakfast)
- Before-school Club (school children) 08:00-08:40 £3.50 (incl. breakfast)
- Before-school Club (nursery children) 08:40-09:00 £1.50

Please note that all children must be booked in <u>at least a week in advance</u> to allow Annie to arrange staffing for the sessions as she has to ensure that staffing ratios are adhered to for children under 8 years of age. Whilst requests at short notice may be accommodated, if staffing allows, this cannot be guaranteed. The current 24-hour notice for cancellation will be enforced if children are booked in and do not turn up on the day.

Leavers

This week we say goodbye to our Year 6 pupils. They have been a tremendous year group, stepping up to all the challenges that the year has thrown at them and taking on a wide range of responsibilities. They have also shown great care towards the younger children this year. They now go on to their new school to become the youngest students themselves and we wish them every success after a restful summer. I hope they will always feel they can drop in at Easebourne to catch up.



Academisation (from Tia Bedford, Chair of Governors)

Earlier this term, a question was raised during a Parent-Governor forum on where we stand with academisation. Given the uncertain climate around the formation of academies, we, as a board of Governors, are exploring the possibilities and are looking to speak with other schools that have recently converted in order to gain a greater understanding of the process and implications for the school. As Chair of Governors, I recently attended a Rother Valley meeting where the future direction of schools in the Rother Valley was discussed. The focus of this was on increased collaboration amongst the 15 schools in the area but not necessarily via academisation. No decisions have been made at this time and it is not one that we intend to rush. As our thoughts develop, we will keep parents informed.

House Challenge

Congratulations to Yellow House, and their captains, Charlie and Ethan, on winning the year's House Challenge Trophy. Though pushed hard by the other houses, Yellow always looked in control and they are worthy winners.

Library Borrowing

Parents will know that we have worked really hard to build up our reading stock in the library over the last two years, pursuing grants, getting support from the PTFA and using some of the school's own budget.

Unfortunately, this great work is being undermined by loss of and damage to books. 170 books have been marked as missing over the last two years and 25 books are currently overdue. We expect wear and tear and occasional books to go missing but this level of replacement compromises our ability to maintain the reading stock, let alone extend it, as we would like to do. We had hoped to buy exciting non-fiction to support the different class topics next year but it is not clear whether we will have the funds to do this.

What are we doing?

- We are committed to supporting the reading of the children at the school. To this end, we are increasing the number of books they can take out over the summer holiday from two to three.
- We will work with our librarians next year to ensure, right at the start of the year, that all children are fully confident with the system of borrowing and returning books.
- We will alert parents to the loss of a book and will let them know the cost of replacing it. We hope that, parents will offer to pay at least 50% of the cost of replacing the book. This will enable us to put the money spent replacing lost books into extending the range available.

What can you do?

- Please encourage your child to take the responsibility of borrowing a book seriously, looking
 after it and making sure it is returned to the library promptly, using the Junior Librarian scanning
 system.
- Please look round at home to see whether you have any of the school's library books.
- Please bear the school library in mind if you have any suitable books which are in good condition but which your family no longer wants.

Summer Reading Challenge

As most of you will know, each summer, the library service runs a wonderful scheme called the Summer Reading Challenge. This year, to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Roald Dahl's birth, the theme is Roald Dahl's books. On Tuesday, Children's Librarian, Kate Pontin, came in to tell the children all about it and we hope that you will encourage your child to participate. It will form the very first house challenge of next year and every child's certificate will go up on display in the hall.

Summer Booklet

Following the success of last year's summer KIT Book spin-off, we are producing another one this year, linking in, as with the Summer Reading Challenge, with the theme of Roald Dahl. There are a number

of activities for your child to take part in over the summer, including a competition from the Parish Council

Parent Evening and Parent View

I hope parents found the parent evening enjoyable and helpful. Parent feedback on the new report format has proved generally very positive and the comments on the new science and art rooms were also very encouraging. We are very lucky to have such a supportive PTFA.

Another positive from the evening was parental participation in Parent View. As explained in the last newsletter, the school is due an inspection from Ofsted in the near future. Part of the process is for the headteacher to notify parents about the inspection and invite them to complete Parent View. Inspectors will then review the evidence from Parent View during the inspection and it will inform their overall judgement about the effectiveness of the school. The opportunity to use Parent View is always there; parents simply register with a password, verify their e-mail address and accept the terms of use. As the notice schools have of an inspection is minimal and many parents miss the opportunity to contribute their views, we have taken advantage of Ofsted's system of creating guest accounts to encourage parents to complete the survey. As a parent/carer, you have therefore been allocated a guest log-in and password.

Thank you to those parents who took the time to submit their opinions during the parent evening. If you haven't yet done so, filling in Parent View at your leisure over the summer will remove the pressure of logging on to Parent View during an autumn inspection. These details will be available in your children's summer booklet.

Parental Request for Second Copies

In the case of families where parents are separated or divorced it is the school policy to provide second copies of correspondence if requested. Please provide the school with an up to date email, address and telephone number and keep us informed of any changes to the information provided. We will send:

- a newsletter fortnightly by email
- a diary termly by email. Dates can also be found on our website
- an invitation to parent evenings in the Autumn and Spring Term by email
- a report which will be posted at the end of the Summer Term

We will email or post any other important letters but will not send second copies of general letters regarding trips, swimming, Forest School etc.

Flu Vaccination in Schools Programme 2016/17

From October to December 2016, all children in Years 1, 2 and 3 in England will be offered a flu vaccination in the form of a nasal spray. Sussex Community NHS Foundation Trust will once again administer the vaccination in West Sussex schools.

We have been allocated 23rd November 2016. A letter asking for parental consent will be sent out next term. Consents will be collected at least two weeks prior to the visit to ensure the team order enough vaccines. Please ensure that you return these letters promptly.

Medicines

If we hold medication for your child in school, please make sure you collect it from the front office on the last day of term. If the medication needs to be returned to us in September, could you please check that it is still in date, update the necessary paperwork for the new academic year and return it with the medication. Asthma pumps and spacers, that have been used, should be cleaned according to the manufacturer's instructions.

It would be really helpful if these items were returned before the start of the term, therefore you will be able to drop them in on the Inset Days or prior to this, when the office is open over the summer. We will send a text out over the summer informing you of these additional times.
