We welcome Mrs. Laycock who will be joining us as a Mid-day Meal Supervisor after half-term on a temporary contract until Christmas.

Community Week (week beginning 12th June)

Throughout the week, we will be working with members of the congregation of St Mary's to develop a wall mural in the hall. On Monday, we will welcome Hamza to the school to work with Foxes and Otters Classes as they are studying Islam this term. Our friends from the South Downs National Park will be visiting the school too. Angela Ward will check whether we have any owlets in the owl box and, if we have, her colleague, Graham Roberts will ring them later in the week. Meanwhile, Amanda Elmes & Jonathan Dean will run Dark Night Skies workshops with our KS2 classes throughout the day on the Tuesday.

Following last year's successful roadshow, we will again encourage parents to visit the RV Parent Roadshow on Wednesday 14th June from 10-12 at the South Downs Centre in Midhurst. Find out about support for your child's health, special needs, self-esteem, learning and behavior. A minibus will drive people down from the school to make this both easier and more sociable. Meet in Reception at 9.45. Later in the day our new Reception parents are invited to a meeting at 6 o'clock. On the Thursday, please could children bring in a £1, we will be having a Non-Uniform Day as our children support the work of the international charity adopted by St Mary's Church, Education West Africa. All money raised will go towards the purchase of uniforms for children who otherwise would not be able to go to school in Sierra

Leone. Continuing with the international community theme, there will also be a gamelan workshop for families on Thursday afternoon and, after school on Friday, there will be a Junior Urgent Action meeting.

At other points during the week, we are also hoping to improve the music room, organise a litter pick of our grounds and the immediate vicinity, a visit to a residential nursing home, a recycled Art House competition for our new display cabinet and a visit to St Mary's Church.

The community theme continues on the Saturday with our third joint school and church fete. Finally, St Mary's will again hold their Sunday service the next day at the school and our families are warmly encouraged to attend.

Dragonflies Open Morning

Dragonflies Open Morning is on Friday 9th June from 8.40am-10.00am, parents/carers are welcome to join us to take part in sharing classroom activities with their child.

Drop-Off Zone

This zone is for the sole purpose of dropping off your child. It is not there for parking, so vehicles should never be without a driver. Once a child has been dropped, cars should move off. If cars are unable to flow through this area, the traffic backs up and often results in the pedestrian crossing being obscured. This puts our children at risk. Understandably, parents of young



children may not want to use the drop-off zone, so please park in the car park and walk your child into school. Please use the drop-off zone appropriately.

Flu Vaccination Programme 2017/18

From October to December 2017, all the children of school years Reception, 1,2,3 and 4 in England will be offered a flu vaccination in the form of a nasal spray. Sussex Community NHS Foundation Trust will once again administer the vaccination in West Sussex schools. Our allocated day for vaccinations is 21st November 2017 and parental consent packs will be sent home in due course.

Rabbits and Badgers Visit Haslemere Museum

This week both Rabbits and Badgers visited Haslemere Museum. We learnt how organs were taken out of a dead body and then prepared for mummification. Some children were lucky enough to actually take the organs out of a body (not a real person obviously!). The parts of the body had to be protected so they were put into canopic jars. The jars each had a different meaning and a different animal as the lid to represent this. The brains were not the most important part of the body and so they were fed to the cats.





In the museum there is a real mummy on display. We could see it's toes. Gross! We learnt the body used to be a priest and was not a Pharaoh because it's arms were by it's side rather than crossed over the chest. We had a great day at the museum especially as we got to do so many exciting activities including looking at and interpreting hieroglyphs, x-rays and special artefacts.
