A Word from the Head

We have been welcomed back after the Easter break with some real summer weather and it is good to see everybody again. May I take this opportunity to remind you that as the weather improves children will need to come to school with sunscreen applied and a sunhat.

We welcome Charlotte Berry to our staff. The children already know Charlotte who worked in the Chartwells kitchen and now joins us as a lunch time supervisor.

The new drop-off and pick-up arrangements have been running for several days now. Though we tried to anticipate all eventualities, I know that there have been a few small issues but hope that parents generally feel that the new system is workable. Please do let us know if you have experienced a problem that we need to address.

There is one key issue that I would like parents to note. Whilst the school is open for some breakfast clubs from 08:00, the school is not technically open until 08:40 for all other children. We have noticed, however, that some children have arrived at school as early as 08:10. Whilst the automatic doors might give the impression of the children having been handed into our care, there is actually no provision for a member of staff to look after them. I would therefore ask parents of children not involved in early morning clubs to try to ensure that their children arrive from 8.40am. That said, we do recognise that some children walking to school or being dropped off may arrive a little earlier because of unpredictable factors such as traffic. For these children, we will try to ensure that any unaccompanied children walking to school or being dropped in the drop-off zone from 08:30 will be supervised in the reception area until the inner doors open at 08:40.

Our KS2 classes were lucky enough to enjoy a golf taster session on Wednesday, thanks to Cowdray Director of Golf and parent, Tim Allen, Assistant Professional, Matt Watson and talented Cowdray junior member, Harry Callow. Matt will be offering Junior after school group sessions from May. Our thanks go to Tim, Matt and Harry.



SRE Discussion Group

Last year, parents may remember that we extended our Sex & Relationships Education (SRE) provision down the school from Year 6 with the intention of covering this curriculum in a specific week each year. Parents were also given the opportunity to view episodes from the video series which we used. At the time, we promised to form a working party with the view of reviewing the school's provision. The time and date set for this group to meet is 5.30 on Monday, 25th April. If you would like to join, please let the office know.
