Chartwells Meals and Cool Milk

Please remember when ordering milk or lunches for September to adjust your child's class name and year group.

Children currently in Year 2 moving up to Year 3 in September will no longer be eligible for Universal Infant Free School Meals but can order a hot meal for currently £2.30 a day from Chartwells. Please log onto www.mealselector.co.uk for more information.

All meals must be paid for in advance unless your child qualifies for either Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) or Free School Meals (FSM).

If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 you are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals. You do not need to register and order through this website. The school will order these meals direct from us. This will include any promotional/festive special meals.

All meals must be ordered a full week in advance of the week that they are required.

Example: If a hot meal is required for any day during week commencing 6th March 2017, the order must be placed and pre-paid either on-line by midnight on Sunday 26th February, or alternatively by telephone to the Chartwells office by 3pm Friday 24th February.

Parents wishing to change their meal schedule after placing their order (e.g in the event of term time holiday, school trip dates, etc) must make on-line alterations prior to the cut-off point for the week in question, alternatively you can contact the Chartwells office via telephone or email, a credit will only be issued if we receive 5 full working days notice. Please see below separate conditions governing absence. In the event of sickness absence from school, meals may be cancelled provided Chartwells receive notification by 10.30am on each day of sickness.

Current Reception and Year 1 children will receive a letter before the end of term giving them the option to opt in or out of Universal Infant Free School Meals. This must be returned by the end of tem.

Parents in receipt of state benefits which give entitlement to free school meals for their children should continue to register. This provides funding to the school not only to fund a free meal but to support eligible pupils with their learning and help towards the cost of school trips, buying educational equipment and with the purchasing of school uniforms.

Music Lessons

On Monday 10th July the children will enjoy a performace from the instrumentalists that we currently have at Easebourne. In September we will be offering music lessons in woodwind, brass, strings, recorder, piano, ukulele, drums and guitar. In the case of families where parents are separated or divorced it is the school policy to provide second copies of correspondence if requested by the parent. We will also email or post any other important letters or invitations but will not send second copies of general letters regarding trips, swimming, Forest School etc.

Parent Governor Elections

We currently have a Parent Governor vacancy to fill. The governor's role is challenging but interesting and is critical to the continued growth and development of our school. This week you should have received an email containing more details and a nomination form. Paper copies are available from the school office.

Medicines

If we hold medication for your child in school, please make sure you collect it from the office on the last day of term. We will send medicines home with a new form to complete for the next academic year. Please ensure you check the expiry date on all medicines and wash out any pumps. We have arranged a number of days before the term starts when the office will be open, Thursday 31st August 12-3, Friday 1st September 9-12 and Monday 4th September all day. **Please can you ensure that you return any medication needed before the start of the new term.**

Library Books

This year, with the pressure on the school's budget, we have reluctantly taken the decision to opt out of West Sussex Schools Library Service. We will be charged for any missing books currently on loan, so please could parents have a **really** good look for any library books that might be hiding at home as they need to go back to West Sussex by the end of term?

Not subscribing to the County's library service will, inevitably, have an impact on the stock of our own library and we plan to set about gradually building up our book stock, starting with spending the commission from the sales at the recent book sale and of 'We Are Writers!'. It would also make a real difference if parents could help their children to look after our school library books and use the Junior Librarian System appropriately (scanning out and back in).

In September, we will be introducing a new system to protect the stock in our library. We will monitor the Junior Librarian system closely and any child that has an overdue book for longer than half a term will receive a letter asking for the book to be replaced or the cost covered by their parent. We hope parents will understand the need for this tighter approach and will support us in this.

Reports and Open Evening – Monday 10th July

Today you should have received home your child's report. This year for Years 1-6, the report includes your child's self-assessment against the 7C's at a midyear point and, again, at the end of the year. It also includes the class teacher's assessment of their relative strengths in these areas. Our work on the 7C's will continue next year and it is our hope that the children's understanding of these areas will steadily grow, along with their ability to reflect and self-evaluate.

We will be holding an Open Evening on Monday 10th July from 3.30-5.30pm. You will be able to see some of the children's work, meet their new class teacher and discuss your child's report with their current teacher. Parents will also have the chance to meet our new Year 1 and Year 5 teachers for September. Mrs Clipston will be here from 3.30pm and Mrs Bedford from 4.30pm.

Sport Day

Our Sports Day will be held on Thursday 13th July, with reserve Sports Day being the following day. Parents and grandparents are invited to join us for the afternoon. The first race will start promptly at 1.00pm. Please make sure children come to school prepared with sunscreen applied and a sunhat. In the event of bad weather this event may be cancelled.

End of Year Celebration Service at St. Mary's Church

On Thursday 20th July the whole school will walk to St. Mary's Church to take part in a service to celebrate the end of the school year. This is a school only event but classes will need volunteers to help walk with the children. Please let the office know if you are available.

Leavers' Assembly and Barbecue

Monday 24th July is Leavers' Day. Year 6 parents and grandparents are invited to the Leavers Assembly at 2.00pm, where the children will be presented with a Yearbook. Snap Chat

You may or may not be aware that Snapchat has introduced a new feature, the 'Snap Map' below is some advice for parents and children on how to use this app safely.

Advice from UK Safer Internet Centre on Snap Map

This location based map allows users to see where in the country their Snapchat contacts are, as well as seeing location based photos and videos. The Snap Map shows a user's Bitmoji, their cartoon avatar within Snapchat, pinpointed on a world map. Users can then zoom into the map to see the exact location of their friends.

How to access Snap Maps

To access the Snap Map in the latest update of the Snapchat app, users need to go to their camera screen within Snapchat and zoom out using two fingers. This will then launch the Snap Maps screen and will allow a user to see their friend's locations.

Choose who can see your location

It is important to be careful about who you share your location with, as it can allow people to build up a picture of where you live, go to school and spend your time. Given how specific this new feature is on Snapchat - giving your location to a precise pinpoint on a map - we would encourage users not to share their location, especially with people they don't know in person.

There are three settings for sharing your location on the map, these are; Ghost mode, My Friends, and Select Friends. But what do these settings mean?

- Ghost Mode
 - Ghost Mode means that you are the only person who can see your location on the map.

Within Ghost Mode you can still see the locations of your friends but they will be unable to see you. This setting will ensure that you have complete control over who knows your location.

My Friends

My Friends means that all of your contacts on Snapchat can see your location. If turning on this setting then it would be important for users to review their Snapchat contacts and also make sure that they never add someone they don't know in person onto Snapchat.

Select Friends

This setting allows users to look through their friend list and then decide which of their friends they want to be able to view their location. This setting gives users the opportunity to control who can view their location

Changing settings

When first opening the Snap Map users get to make a decision as to who they want to be able to view their location. Once these settings are in place they can always be changed in Snapchat's settings. This can be done in two ways:

1. In the Snapchat settings

In the Snapchat screen click on the Settings (cog) icon> click on 'see my location' > Choose the setting which suits you

2. On the Snap Map

Click on the setting button in the top right of the map > choose the setting which suits you **Our top tips**

Sharing location can be a risky thing to do. Our tips for location sharing are:

- Only share your location with people you know in person. Never share your location with strangers.
- Don't add contacts to Snapchat if you don't know them in person.
- Regularly review your settings and take an active decision about whether you want people to know your location. Remember you can switch this off at any time. Think about where you are sharing your location. Location services such as Snap Maps can lead people to your house. Think about what times you are on the app and whether these are locations you want to share if not, then turn this off within your settings.
