Last week, we held our Remembrance Service down at St Mary's, gathered round the war memorial. Afterwards, we walked back through the church so that we could see all of the beautifully displayed poppies that Alison Davis had organised the community to make.

We also planted lots of Woodland Trust trees in the labyrinth and spring bulbs along the bank. We celebrated Odd Socks Day as part of Anti-Bullying Week and finished on Friday with a great PTFA Film Night, enjoyed by the children in their nightwear and raising £235 for Children in Need and money for the PTFA in the process!

Next week, I would like to draw parents' attention to four dates.

- Mindfulness Talk Thursday, 29<sup>th</sup> November @ 18:00 Parents may well have noticed that children's mental health and well-being is a key educational issue across the country at present. So much so, that it was the focus of a whole day's Rother Valley Conference before half-term where the teaching staff from all the primary schools in the locality came together to hear from experts drawn from various fields.

One of those experts was Sandrine Cranswick who has been teaching mindfulness for a number of years and I am delighted that Sandrine will be delivering a mindfulness course over the spring term to each of the classes from Squirrels to Otters. Sandrine will be at the school on Thursday to talk to parents about mindfulness and I will join her to set out my concerns about the pressures on children's well-being that have prompted me to introduce this initiative to Easebourne. I do hope that you will be able to join us to hear more about mindfulness and how your children will benefit.
