### COVID-19 Advice for Parents


Public Health England have produced a COVID-19 information sheet for parents and carers which gives clear advice on what parents should do in each of the different scenarios that they might encounter. You should have received this as an email earlier in the week, and I do recommend that you read it and print it off so that you have it to refer to. Paper copies will be available at Reception if you are unable to print it off at home.

### Parent Consultation Meetings

Due to Covid-19, this term's parent meetings, where you are able to discuss your child's progress with their class teacher, will be via Zoom. Meetings will be held w/c 19<sup>th</sup> October, with the exception of Dragonflies Class whose parent meetings will be w/c 2<sup>nd</sup> November.

Next week, you will receive a link to your mobile phone or email address that will take you to our online booking system where you can select a convenient time that suits you. Each class has separate time slots available, therefore you will receive a link for each child. The class teacher will email you the Zoom link prior to the meetings. Appointments will last for 10 minutes and will need to finish promptly as the next parent will already be in the 'waiting room.' If parents are unable to make any of the appointment times available, they should contact the class teacher to schedule an additional virtual or telephone meeting.

**YOU SHOULD BOOK A TEST FOR YOUR CHILD IF THEY HAVE ANY OF:**

- A HIGH TEMPERATURE:** That means they feel hot to touch, with the thermometer showing a temperature of 38°C or above (you do not need to measure their temperature).
- A NEW CONTINUOUS COUGH:** That means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 2-3 more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if they usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual).
- A LOSS OF SENSE OF SMELL OR TASTE:** This means they no longer can smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

**IF YOUR CHILD DOES NOT HAVE SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 BUT HAS OTHER COULD BE SYMPTOMS, SUCH AS A RASH, HEADACHE OR MORE THIRST, THEY DO NOT NEED TO BE TESTED. THEY AND THE REST OF THEIR HOUSEHOLD DO NOT NEED TO SELF-ISOLATE (UNLESS SOMEBODY ELSE IN THE HOUSEHOLD HAS SYMPTOMS OR HAS TESTED POSITIVE, OR PORN HAVE STRONGER REASONS TO BELIEVE IN THIS TEST AND ANALYSIS).**

**YOUR CHILD CAN RETURN TO NURSERY/SCHOOL/COLLEGE IF THEY ARE WELL ENOUGH TO DO SO.**



### **Starting School Reception September 2021**

If your child was born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2016 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2017, they can start school in September 2021. From Monday, 5<sup>th</sup> October 2020 to Friday, 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021, you can apply online on the pupil Admissions Application website at [www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions](http://www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions). For parents who do not have access to the internet at home, free access has been arranged at all libraries and Children and Family Centres within West Sussex. Once you have submitted your online application you will receive an automatic email acknowledgement confirming that your email has been received. Paper forms will only be issued to parents on request and need to be sent back to the Pupil Admissions Team by recorded delivery. Applications made after the closing date cannot be considered until all other applications have been dealt with. Online applicants will be notified which school their child has been offered by email during the day on Friday, 16<sup>th</sup> April 2021. Other applicants will be sent a letter by second class post, posted on 16<sup>th</sup> April.

## EASEBOURNE PTFA NEWS

We are pleased to announce that we've organised a clothes, shoe & linen collection with Bag2School in order to raise funds for our school.

As well as raising vitally needed funds for Easebourne Primary School, **Bag2School** also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill.

By getting involved in our **Bag2School** collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles in the bag provided – this can include adults' and children's clothes, shoes (tied together please), hats, belts, handbags and soft toys, (please refer to <http://uk.bag2school.com/> for full details). In addition to raising much needed funds it will also raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.

If you fill the donation bag and still have more items, you can use any other bag to donate your items and don't forget to ask grandparents, friends and neighbours to have a sort out as well!

**Bag2School** will be collecting at our school on Tuesday 10 November. Please bring your bag (or bags!) to the drop off point on **Friday 6 November or Monday 9<sup>th</sup> November during school drop up and pick up times** and help us have a really good collection. The drop off point will be near the car park in the unused part of the school building and will be sign posted.



**In September you have managed to raise a total of £49.22** for the school via online shopping with Easyfundraising! A huge thanks to everyone who has signed up and are actively using it, a particularly big thanks to the individual parent whose contribution was £45 in a single online transaction when they signed up to Sky TV for the first time! So if you are about to make any sizeable purchases in the next few weeks or in the run up to Christmas, this example helps demonstrate the difference you could make. To give another example, another parent is helping raise 50p a week through their Sainsburys, weekly, online shop. So if you haven't yet signed to the site or just keep forgetting to shop via [www. easyfundraising.org.uk](http://www.easyfundraising.org.uk) then the easiest thing to do would be to download the donation reminder app. If 100 parents raised just 50p a month through their shopping for example, that would be £50/month or £600 a year, just by clicking on an icon on your phone when you shop. Do remember, it is the retailer who donates, not you, so it costs you NOTHING.

Sorry if we sound like a stuck record, but we'd really love more parents and staff to use this app as it is by far the easiest way to raise money for school. So please, please, please sign up and remember to use it.
