Gardening SOS

Easebourne Primary School has an up and coming garden space. Our fundamental ethos is to garden organically using a holistic approach which gives children learning opportunities which inspire them to learn where our food comes from and how it is grown, and also to taste many different varieties of fruit and vegetables.

Last year was a wonderful success and it was a joy to watch the garden start to develop, but in order for it to continue to grow, we need your help. I am asking if anyone would like to get involved as a volunteer, donating any time you have, no matter how big or small. Anyone who has knowledge, skills and experience in gardening that they wish to share are all warmly welcomed. However you don't need to be Alan Titchmarsh or Monty Don. We are looking for people from any gardening background or with none at all. Physical constraints needn't be a barrier either as we can cater for your individual needs. There will be a mixture of light gardening sessions which involve helping to supervise the children in small group sessions, as they learn how to sow seed, plant, water and harvest as well as the more physically demanding sessions which involve a small amount of soil preparation, care and maintenance of our garden composter and making small growing props and general weeding and upkeep etc. This year I would like to introduce fun and humour into my sessions by decorating our own plant pots and planting labels.

Clubs

Clubs for this term start Monday, 14th January. A list of clubs is displayed in the window of the front office. Some clubs are oversubscribed and a waiting list will be in operation. If your child fails to attend a club on a regular basis, their place will be offered to a child on the waiting-list. Please send in any outstanding fees next week before clubs start.

How Clubs Are Allocated

We understand that there has been some upset, especially in KS1, over the allocation of clubs this term. We would like to reassure you that we spend a lot of time and make every effort to provide as many club options as possible. Not all members of staff can be expected to run a club on top of their other responsibilities and we think that we do offer more clubs than most other schools. There is no charge for staff-run clubs. We have to charge for clubs where external providers are used but even this is sometimes subsidised.

We also try to be as fair as possible when allocating clubs. In previous years, we allocated places on a first come, first served basis. Currently, we number each request as it is received and then on the closing date we go through each one, allocating first options as far as possible. If we run out of places, we then ensure that the second options are met. Having run through all the requests once, we then start at the beginning and repeat the process.

Of course, some clubs are extremely popular and fill up quickly, especially if there are limited places. These are normally very hands-on clubs such as cooking and craft where a lot of supervision is required. Cookery is also limited by the size of the kitchen and the equipment available. For other clubs we do, as you know, put out requests for parental help but this is often unsuccessful.

Next term, we will endeavour to allocate cookery slots to those children who are on this term's waiting list and who put this down again as their first option. As already noted on the forms, it is imperative that you list options in order of preference.

If you can think of a better system to ensure fairness, please let us know.

Second Cookery Club Possibility

In the meantime, we could try to offer more cookery slots each term, using another day when the kitchen is not in use. If we could gather a 'cookery team' of parents/carers together, then they could, between them staff each week with a pair of volunteers. If there was a good response, we could ensure that all volunteers were DBS-checked in time to offer an additional cookery club for next term. If you think you might be interested, please contact the office staff.

Debate Club

On Friday, 18th January, we will be holding our first Debate Club of this term for KS2. This will run after school from 3.15-4.15pm. The motion will be debated by older KS2 children. Debate thrives on an audience and we would very much welcome any adults and children who would like to watch, listen and vote. Questions from the floor are also very helpful in giving the children a sense of what a debate can be like. You can see what the children will be debating from the motions below.

- 18th January This House believes that every child should have a pet.
- 1st February This House believes that books are better than television.
- 15th March This House believes that it is better to live in the countryside.

We are continuing to trial an earlier start time so consultations will start when the children attend assembly with their T/A's.

Mrs Cafferty, our Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator, will also be available on the Thursday and if you would normally meet with her you can request a joint meeting with Mrs Cafferty and your child's class teacher by adding a note to your booking.

On Tuesday, 22nd January, you should receive a link to your mobile phone or email address which takes you to our online booking system to select a time convenient to you. If you did not receive this, or need help booking an appointment, please contact the school office.
