Poetry Festival

Last Friday, we were joined by Ann Marchand, Jo Lorimer-Green and Geoff Allnutt for our annual poetry recitation competition. There were exactly 100 entries which was really encouraging and the judges just managed to squeeze everybody into the morning. Each child who entered won a point for their house and the winning house was Blue House, with 29 entries. The judges noted that the children were challenging themselves more this year, many choosing the more difficult poems to learn. Next year, we may dispense with categories for the different age-ranges and just grade the poems in terms

of challenge so that the children can decide just how much they feel they are able to challenge themselves.

The KS1 Winner was Eleanor B, the Lower KS2 Winner was Charlie W and the Upper KS2 Winner was Roberta. The overall joint winners were Eleanor (Y2) and Roberta (Y5). Eleanor recited 'The World's Most Popular Mother' by Lindsay Macrae whilst Roberta recited 'Talking Turkeys' by Benjamin Zephaniah. Two additional awards were made to Natalia (Y5) and Tabitha (Y4) for their original poems.

Today, Steve Tasane has been with us, holding workshops with the different phases from KS1 up to Upper KS2. Everybody should have been invited to the Poetry & Pasties celebration today (3.30-5.00) where Steve Tasane and Geoff Allnutt, both performance poets, will present prizes to those picked out for special mention (see below). In addition, Steve will perform some of his poems and also read extracts from his new book, 'Child I', a book about children living in a refugee camp. Steve will be signing copies of his book which Geoff, his friend, tells me would be appropriate for 9-11 year olds. Children receiving prizes will have the opportunity to recite their poem again at the event.

Parking Plea



I have had several reports of parents parking in such a way that their vehicles have compromised the children's safety when crossing the car park or blocked other vehicles in. We have, as we know, the good fortune in having a car park far larger than many of our neighbouring schools, but we also know that it is still not as big as we would like. First in all of our priority lists should be keeping the children safe and I would ask all parents to bear this in mind when parking. Parking near the zebra crossing clearly compromises the visibility of our children and makes the journey to and from school more dangerous for those children who are able to walk with or without their parents. Equally, leaving a car

unattended when it is blocking other cars is antisocial. Please use the car park as thoughtfully as you can. In the meantime, if you have suggestions that would lead to safer and more efficient use, please do let us know.

Remembrance Service – KS1 and KS2 only

On Monday 12th November, the school, with the exception of Dragonflies Class, will be walking to St. Mary's Church to take part in a ceremony to honour and remember those who have died in service to their country since the end of the First World War. We will leave school at 10.15am to arrive for 10.30am and be back in time for lunch. We would be very grateful for any parental help to walk the children to and from church. Please make sure your child has a coat in school. Those children who belong to the Guiding or Scouting family are welcome to wear their uniform to school.



Anti-Bullying Week (wb 12th November)



Next week is Anti-Bullying Week and we want to mark this by joining in with the Anti-Bullying Odd Socks Day on Tuesday 13th November. We are not treating this as a fundraiser, simply a graphic way for the children (and staff) to join together to show that bullying is not okay at Easebourne Primary School by wearing odd socks. It stands to reason that children might want to make this message clear by wearing eye-catching and possibly clashing socks!

Flu Immunisations – Years R, 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5

Just a reminder that flu immunisations for the above classes are on Friday 23rd November. For those of you who have requested a vaccination for your child please ensure you read the following:-

Eligibility assessment on day of vaccination

- Has the parent reported the child being wheezy over the past three days
- If the child has asthma, has the parent reported any reason why vaccination should be postponed? eg. Use of oral steroids or, an increase in inhaled steroids in the past 14 days?
- Does the child have any contraindications today for the Nasal Flu Vaccination

If any of the above statements apply on the day, please hand a note containing any relevant information for the nurses into the office, so that we can pass it on to the medical team.

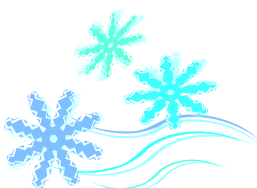
School Photographs

Library Books

Please ensure all overdue library books are returned as our stock is currently quite low. We would be grateful if parents could help their children to look after our school library books and use the Junior Librarian System appropriately. Any child that has an overdue book for longer than half a term will receive a letter asking for the book to be replaced or the cost covered.

Procedures in the event of school closure due to inclement weather



The decision to close the school in the event of inclement weather is not taken lightly and is based on the safety of both pupils and staff, some of whom have to travel quite a considerable distance.

Should we have to close at any point during the winter months, we will endeavour to make a decision by 7.30am and the closure will be posted on the school's website at: <http://www.easebourne.w-sussex.sch.uk> Closures will also be posted on the West Sussex County Council website at: <http://www.westsussex.gov.uk> we will also send a text message to parents.

There may be circumstances when the decision is taken to close during the school day due to rapidly changing weather conditions. In these cases parents will be sent a text message. A member of staff

will remain at the school with the children until the last child has been collected.

Given that information about school closure is communicated by text please ensure that you inform the school office of any changes to your number. If the school is open and your child is unable to get in, please notify the office by 9.00am leaving a message on the absence line. After-school clubs will be cancelled if the weather conditions are poor. Children should wear appropriate clothing for the conditions, including waterproof footwear to go out to play i.e. wellington or snow boots and a change of footwear for class. A coat, hat, a pair of gloves and a change of socks would also be advisable.

Sumdog House Competition

A new Sumdog House Challenge for Years 1-6 will be starting on Friday 23rd November at 8am (running until Thursday 29th November at 8pm) and we would like as many children as possible to take part!

Children answering at least 100 questions will earn a house point. Any child answering 1,000 questions over the course of the week, will become an Easebourne Sumdog Ninja and be invited to play for the school in future competitions. They will also receive a new Ninja Agent membership card!

Please note that your child's username and password can be found in their Kit Book. The school code is easebourne-primary-school. Please also be aware that your child's level is determined by the site, not the school. If your child has not been on Sumdog for a while, it may be worth them spending a bit of time on it before the competition starts, as they may be asked questions that are either too easy or too hard. Please do not worry if this happens, as this is how Sumdog works out the appropriate level for your child.

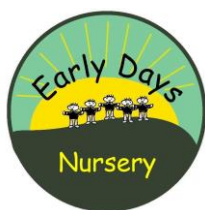
