
# Chris Riddell Illustrated Talk @ Easebourne Primary School





All proceeds will go towards purchasing books for the school library.













I have been to two of Chris's illustrated talks and they are spellbinding. He talks very entertainingly about his work and, as he talks, he draws captivating illustrations in front of your eyes. I was thrilled when he agreed to give a talk for the school's library and very much hope that parents will be able to come and support this event. I have used several books that Chris has illustrated or written and illustrated at children's book clubs over the year and they are very popular – a range of his titles is

included below. We will try to have a range of his books available for parents who would like to buy one afterwards for Chris to sign.











Chris Riddell, OBE is a British illustrator and writer of children's books as well as being a political cartoonist for the Observer. He has won three Kate Greenaway Medals, the British librarians' annual award for the best-illustrated children's book. Books that he wrote or illustrated have won three Nestlé Smarties Book Prizes and have been silver or bronze runners-up four times. On 9 June 2015 he was appointed the UK Children's Laureate. The role of Children's Laureate is awarded once every two years to an eminent writer or illustrator of children's books to celebrate outstanding achievement in their field. Chris succeeded Malorie Blackman and has been succeeded by Lauren Child. Chris was awarded an OBE for services to illustration and charity in the New Years' Honours List for 2019. # Five Ways to Wellbeing

On Friday 1st February, Year 5 will take part in a Five Ways to Wellbeing Workshop. The aim of the day is to support the mental health of children and to educate them on how to incorporate the Five Ways to Wellbeing into their daily lives. This will be done through workshops which are fun, but also a thought provoking way to build confidence, improve positivity and self-esteem. Activities such as brain aerobics help improve memory, further brain function and concentration. Songs and dances improve coordination, team-work and powerful relaxation. There is a snack and chat picnic to explore new tastes discussing the importance of eating healthily.

### Debate Club - Pet Debate

Last Friday, a small group gathered to hear four children from Otters Class debate whether every child should have a pet.

Isla and Tam spoke for the motion. They pointed out that having pets leads to lower blood pressure in their owners, as well as more physically active lifestyles and lower cholesterol. They argued that children with pets tend to get outside more and enjoy more fresh air and that you can have fun with a pet, even a ferret! Plus, of course, pets are really cute!

Kitty and Theo W spoke against the motion. Their arguments included the fact that pets' shorter lives mean that children have to cope with the death of animals with which they have developed emotional attachments. They also explained that pets can trigger allergic reactions in children and disrupt children's sleep. From their research, they were able to produce statistics about the number of deaths from dog attacks in the US. This side also pointed out that parents often get stuck with the care of pets as children don't always honour their promises to care for their pets!

After some tricky questions from the floor, including the impact of universal pet ownership on the future of zoos, a second vote was taken. In the end, Kitty and Theo managed to persuade more people to their side and they carried the day. Well done to all four speakers, especially to Tam who stepped in at the last moment to cover.

Our next Debate Club is on Friday 1st February and the motion will be 'This House believes that books are better than television.' It is great to have an interested and feisty audience so please do put the date in your diary and come and make up your mind on this debate.
