A Word from the Head

It's the end of Week 3 and it's been a busy few weeks. Last week, Years 5 and 6 had their residential on the Isle of Wight. When I visited them on the Thursday, they looked so happy and were clearly having a great time. More recently, Foxes have had their first Playtime workshop, following a visit and initial workshop at Chichester Festival Theatre. This is a very exciting initiative for the class. Otters have started their forest school sessions and other classes are well into their topics and planning visits of their own.

Heavy Horses

We are very fortunate to be having some Canadian Belgian heavy horses visiting the school on Tuesday, 1st October. This has been generously organised for us by Jumbo Lovatt and the classes will have a half-hour session, learning about these huge beasts.

We are aware that some children are sensitive to animal hair. If you would like your child withdrawn from this session or if you are happy for them to attend the talk but would like them be kept at a greater distance from the horses, please would you send a note into the office to this effect. All children will be supervised after the event to ensure they wash their hands.

If you are happy for your child to take part in this experience but you would need to administer a dose of antihistamine before school, please ensure that the office is aware that this medication has been dispensed. Thank you.

Starting School Reception September 2020

If your child was born between 1st September 2015 and 31st August 2016 they can start school in September 2020. From Monday 7th October 2019 to Wednesday 15th January 2020, you can apply online on the pupil Admissions Application website at www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions. Once you have submitted your online application you will receive an automatic email acknowledgement confirming that your email has been received. Free internet access to apply online is available at all West Sussex libraries and Children and Family Centres for parents who do not have access to a computer. Paper forms will only be issued to parents on request by phoning 0333 0142903 and forms need to be sent back to the Pupil Admissions Team by recorded delivery. Applications made after the closing date cannot be considered until all other applications have been dealt with. Online applicants will be notified which school their child has been offered by email during the day of Thursday 16th April 2020. Other applicants will be sent a letter by second class post, posted on 16th April.
