What an opportunity, to work with children on an exciting project! Four years ago, we started the Greenpower Goblin project at Easebourne. The aim is to introduce Year 6 children to engineering principles by getting them to build an electric racing car which would then be entered in competitive events involving many other schools. First we raced one car and won prizes. Then we built a second car. We now have one completed car and the second is awaiting reconstruction, greatly delayed because of Covid. It has been a great pleasure to work with enthusiastic and imaginative young people and to experience the motivation and teamwork that develops during the year. KS1

During this very short week, children in Hedgehogs have been looking further into parts of plants. We have thought about how we can plant them and the order in which we can give instructions. After practising our instructions with a friend the children wrote the instructions, together with a diagram, in their books. Over the next couple of weeks, the children will keep a journal to see how the plants develop. The children will need to measure to see how tall they have grown, write about the care we have taken of them and look carefully to make an observational diagram to show how the seed progresses.



It has been a very strange week in Squirrels but we have come back from the long weekend with some enthusiasm especially as our tables have all moved around and we are able to work in small groups within our Bubble again. We have also been spending lots of time looking at multiplication and writing repeating minibeast poems, one of our favourite lines is 'Spider Spider, creepy crawling on the floor, Spider Spider, hiding behind the door!'. In PE this month we are challenging ourselves to 'A mile a day in May'. We are hoping to improve our fitness and the speed that we can complete a mile in.

KS2

In Mrs Daley's class we are learning about the Trinity in RE this term. This week, we have been comparing and discussing the 'Baptism of Jesus' paintings by Verrocchio and Daniel Bonnell for symbolism. We are also writing our own version of the 'Grace' for our class.

In 3H we started looking at Microbes as part of our E4S curriculum (Education 4 Safeguarding). We put a virus (glitter) on the hands of three children in our class and watched how quickly it spread – showing how important good handwashing is. Then we made a sneeze corridor and used a spray bottle to see how far a virus can travel when it leaves the body in a sneeze!

In French, Badgers Class played a game where one person had to say a French sentence and the children from another colour team had to guess what we said. Blue team won the first round, Red team won the second.

Foxes have been working hard on mastering our SPaG skills in English we even tackled SATs questions! The most exciting part of the week was receiving our new class pets - ladybirds. We will be studying the life cycle of our insects and making detailed observations of what happens next.

Otters recorded their live singing performances. Usually, Year 6 would sing at Chichester Cathedral, but this year we are creating a singing mash up! We sang 'My Lighthouse' and '10,000 Reasons'. We sung '10,000 Reasons' really beautifully (it made Miss Glanville a bit teary!) and we loved doing the actions for 'My Lighthouse'.
