A Word from the Head

Dear Parents,

Sadly, today we say goodbye to Molly Stringer who has been assisting in the office for nearly two years whilst undertaking her business administration apprenticeship. Having spent time in a school environment Molly has decided she would like to continue work with children and starts her new job in a nursery next week. We wish Molly every success in her new role.

There is very exciting news about creation of the Wheelbarrow Castle Community Space and Play Park. Ian Milne has written an update (see below). We understand that three different contractors will be involved but the Parish Council are committed to minimising the disruption to the school whilst the project is under way. This will be a wonderful facility for our families and it is tremendous news that the children will be able to enjoy it during the summer holidays if work goes according to plan.

Traffic News

I met this week with Clare Faulkner, Project Support Officer for Local Transport Improvements, to discuss how to promote pupil safety and greener travel across the school through a national scheme called Modeshift Stars initiative. We identified a number of areas on which to work and a key one was the school's lack of crossing patrol through long-term absence and difficulty with recruitment. After a long period without a crossing patrol, a survey of numbers of children walking to and from school indicated that there wasn't enough pedestrian traffic to warrant the patrol being reinstated. Clare has arranged for our need to be reassessed next week, on Wednesday, 9th May. I have always believed strongly that this crossing patrol must be reinstated. A school survey parents completed about this issue indicated that many parents would walk to school if there was a crossing patrol.



However, nothing will happen unless we demonstrate that this is the case. If you want to see a crossing patrol back on Wheelbarrow Castle, you need to **vote with your feet on Wednesday** and be counted. So **PLEASE** try to make one or both of those journeys on foot next Wednesday if this is an option you would sometimes choose if we had a crossing patrol.

On the subject of traffic, I have received reports of two instances of parents pulling out onto Wheelbarrow Castle forcing drivers of cars to swerve or brake to avoid hitting them. We ask cars to drive at 20mph around the school and many do. In return, please be respectful of traffic as you enter and leave the school in your car.

Crockery Wanted

Later on this term, the children will be working on a mosaic in the courtyard with students from Seaford College. This project will require crockery fragments so if you have any coloured crockery which you no longer want but would be happy to see incorporated into this project, please do leave them with the office. Clearly, chipped or cracked crockery is perfectly satisfactory for this.

Recruitment Tea Party

As part of Community Week (wb 25th June), we are holding a Recruitment Tea Party. If you know anybody who would enjoy volunteering in some capacity to support the school of you would like to yourself, please support this event. It will take place at 2 o'clock on Thursday, 28th June. I hope that as many of our existing volunteers as can will be able to be there to talk about their experience.
