Plastics

This year, I'm trying to use minimal plastics at the fair, therefore:

- Please bring your own "bag for life" to carry your prizes and purchases as we will not be handing out plastic carrier bags.
- Pint Pots will be displayed either in a paper bag or reusable cup (which will be recycled for the next event) and transferred to paper bag when won (please recycle your paper bag!).
- Bottles of water/squash will be available to buy at the bar, but we will also have a "refill" option so children can re-use the bottles.
- If you use a plastic "glass" from the Bar, please re-use it and when finished put it in the recycling bins (which I hope to be able to provide)
- Please use the bins appropriately plastic and cans in one and general rubbish in the other.
 They will be labelled.

Foxes and Otters parents - we need your help please. We currently have just one person on the BBQ (Otters) and NOBODY on the Inflatables (foxes). We can't run these stalls without volunteers to man them.

At the BBQ we'll have burgers, hot dogs and savoury snacks, so perfect for lunch time, with the fair starting at 1pm. The bar will be selling wine, larger, cider, prosecco, soft drinks and water.

Easebourne Park construction update

As some of you may have already seen, work has well and truly commenced on the early stages of the park. The drainage channels are in, with the exit of the drainage pipe designed to flow into the pond. the pond itself has been excavate and the



natural clay liner due to be delivered and fitted early next week. The oak wood trunks and branches, kindly donated by the Cowdray Estate, will be delivered over the next 2 weeks with the first deliveries starting on Mon 25 June. These deliveries will be timed to cause minimum disruption to the school car park users. if this fine weather continues, the progress of the Park will be swift. Finally, we are to ensure that this park is to be dog friendly, but will ask owners to keep dogs on the lead near play equipment. To that end, we intend to install, subject to funds being available, 2 dog-bag dispensers at the 2 entrances to the field. They cost £100 each - any sponsors out there willing to help us by funding these dispensers please?
